- New Zealand has one of the highest rates of breast cancer in the world, and it is continuing to grow.
- One in nine women in this country will develop breast cancer during their lifetime.
- Around 2,600 New Zealand women are diagnosed with breast cancer each year – that's six every day.
- More than 660 New Zealand women will die from breast cancer this year.
- While the incidence of breast cancer is highest in women aged 50 to 54, 25% of breast cancers occur in women under the age of 50 and 5% occur in women under 40.
- One in 10 men in New Zealand will lose a sister, mother, daughter or wife to breast cancer.
- Maori women have a 47.7% higher mortality rate than women of European descent.
- 95% of breast cancers occur in women who have no family history of the disease.
- We are committed to finding a cure for breast cancer by 2018.

BACKGROUND TO THE TRUST

The Breast Cancer Research Trust was founded in 1997 on the vision of Dr John Harman, MBChB, FRACS, Breast & General Surgeon who is a current Trustee & Chair of the Medical Advisory Committee.

At the time of formation there was very little breast cancer research funding available to researchers requiring the intellectual freedom to investigate cutting edge research and breakthrough technology.

Thanks to the Breast Cancer Research Trust there is now both money and an approval process that gives certainty to both the projects and the researchers who own those projects. Since its establishment many significant research projects have now been funded in New Zealand, with an excess of \$7 million in grants provided.

The Trust's work continues to grow in importance, especially as breast cancer in New Zealand grows at epidemic proportions. Five years ago one in 10 women would be diagnosed, now the rate is one in eight. The lives of over 660 NZ women of all ages and from all walks of life are being lost each year. This disease has a devastating impact on women and their families throughout this country, across all ages and social groups. The continued escalation of cases can only have a negative effect on our society.

With virtually no government funding, and with the governments of today unlikely to be able to finance the search for solutions to the vast number of serious illnesses society is faced with in these times, our world leading researchers are heavily dependent on the private sector and charitable organisations.

The Breast Cancer Research Trust is New Zealand's only not-for-profit organisation established solely to support research into breast cancer. And we're committed to finding a cure to this disease by 2018.
